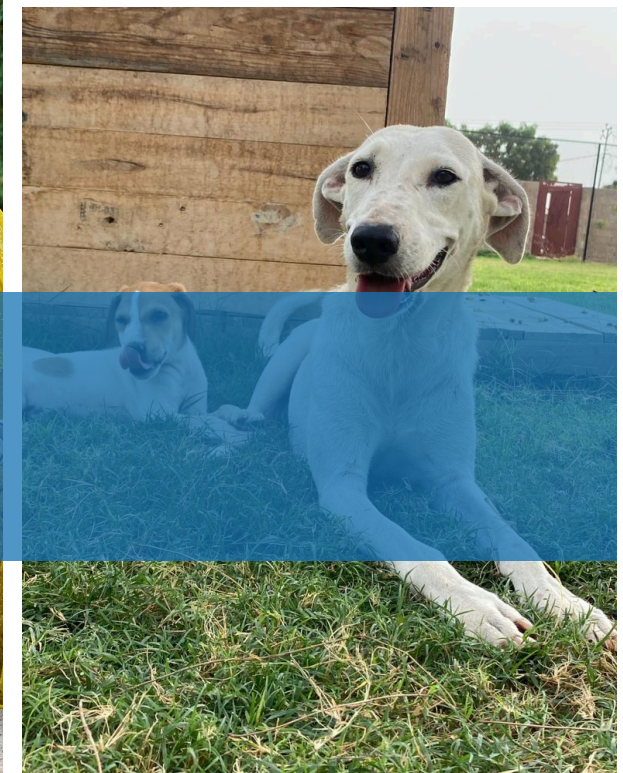

SUBJECT:- SIGNING OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) BETWEEN GOVERNMENT OF PAKISTAN AND M/S COMPREHENSIVE DISASTER RESPONSE SERVICES (CDRS)


Dear Sir,

This is to inform you that the Government of Pakistan is pleased to register and sign MoU with M/S Comprehensive Disaster Response Services (CDRS) for a period upto 21st November 2024 for the projects “(i) CDRS House of Blessings (Orphanage) (ii) Benji Animal Welfare Project (iii) Clean Water Project” located in Islamabad, KPK, Punjab and Sindh with the following conditions;

- Annual Action Plan (APA) of every new Activity/Project involving foreign funding will be required to be submitted to EAD along with the Project and Financing Agreement with the Donor/INGO well in time before commencing the project
- Organization will seek concurrence of EAD if it changes its thematic area of working and expands geographical location of its activities other than that given in the signed MoU.
- Organization will work with registered INGOs.
- Not to use controversial terms like “Peace & Conflict Resolution, IDPs etc in your annual reports or any other Documents/Correspondence/Agreements.
- Organization will not employ any individual of Indian and Israeli nationality/origin.
- The organization will declare to the Government all foreign contributions, along with the terms and conditions of those contributions, as well as details of all bank accounts maintained by it. The organization will maintain accounts under internationally recognized accounting standards, get these accounts audited on an annual basis by a registered Chartered Accountancy firm and will provide to the Government a copy of the audited annual statements, along with a certificate from the Auditors to the effect that the foreign contributions have been utilized for the objectives of the organization as specified in the MOU.
- Organization shall receive foreign contributions through banking channel only. However, while doing so, it will have to comply with the Anti Money Laundering and other relevant rules as per applicable in Pakistan
- Limit your work to concrete socio-economic activities.
- NGO will not indulge in any advocacy related activity during project execution.
- NOC for current project only; completion report will be forwarded by NGO to EAD.
- No deviation from stated project and location without security clearance from EAD.

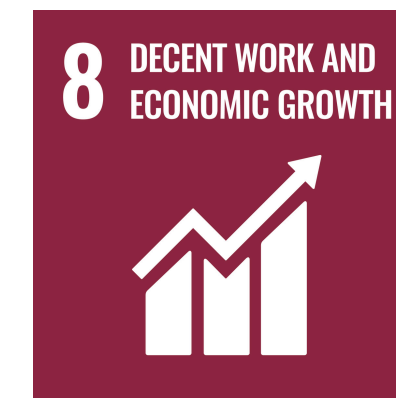



CDRS H2O CLEAN DRINKING WATER

A major crisis facing Pakistan is the scarcity of safe and clean drinking water in many areas of the country. CDRS currently has over 750 water projects operating in poor and remote communities all over Pakistan, from hand pumps to deeper wells with electric or solar pumps, to water storage tanks, seep wells, gravity flow systems, filtration systems, rainwater collection devices, reverse osmosis filtration plants, and refurbishment of neglected, broken-down wells. CDRS monitors, tests, maintains, and repairs of all our wells. These life-giving projects provide clean drinking water to tens of thousands of thirsty people and livestock 365 days a year.

CDRS BENJI TNVR & ANIMAL WELFARE

The CDRS Benji Project operates and maintains 4 Rescue and TNVR centres in Pakistan (Islamabad, Lahore, Karachi, and Skardu) for the humane population control of stray abandoned domesticated dogs and cats, along with providing medical care, housing, and rehabilitation for abused, disabled and orphaned animals. The Benji Project made history by operating Pakistan's first national fleet of vehicles and opening Pakistan's first facility dedicated to trap, neuter, vaccinate, and release (TNVR), and is collaborating with government officials to implement Animal Welfare and TNVR programs in Islamabad, Lahore & Skardu.

GOVERNANCE & RULE OF LAW

Capacity Building Trainings & Research Projects:

- ORGANIZED NUMEROUS CAPACITY-BUILDING WORKSHOPS FOR PUNJAB REVENUE AUTHORITY (PRA) STAFF, RANGING FROM COMMISSIONER LEVEL TO OFFICER GRADE, COVERING ESSENTIAL AREAS SUCH AS TAX LAWS, REGULATIONS, AND IT SKILLS REQUIRED FOR EFFICIENT OFFICE MANAGEMENT. ADDITIONALLY, HELPED DEVELOP TRAINING MODULES FOR THESE WORKSHOPS.
- CONDUCTED A COMPREHENSIVE STUDY ON URBAN IMMOVABLE PROPERTY TAX(UIPT) IN KP TO EXPLORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR REFORMS AND INCREASE REVENUE GENERATION EFFICIENCY. RECOMMENDED SEVERAL IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDING ADOPTING A GIS-BASED SYSTEM, REGULAR PROPERTY SURVEYS, AND ENHANCING TAXPAYER ENGAGEMENT.
- CONDUCTED A SCOPING STUDY ON OWN SOURCE REVENUE OSR IN LOCAL GOVERNMENTS OF PUNJAB.
- CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT & TRAINING WAS PROVIDED TO LOCAL GOVERNMENT STAFF IN KPK ON HOW TO USE COVID-19 PREVENTION-RELATED EQUIPMENT PROVIDED BY CDRS.
- CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT & MORE THAN 500 STAFF MEMBERS RECEIVED TRAINING ON 'OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH EDUCATION FOR FRONTLINE STAFF AND SANITARY WORKERS'
- DEVELOPMENT OF TRAINING MANUALS AND CONDUCTING TRAINING SESSIONS FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT STAFF IN 19 SELECTED TMAS OF KPK, ON HOW TO USE THE NEWLY DEVELOPED FINANCIAL RECORD MANAGEMENT SYSTEM.



BENEFICIARIES

MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES:

The project directly benefited local government employees who received training and equipment to perform their roles more safely and effectively.

GENERAL PUBLIC:

Indirect beneficiaries include the residents of the municipalities where these measures were implemented. Improved sanitary conditions and more efficient tax collection systems have a broad impact on community health and the availability of municipal funds for public services.

GOVERNANCE & RULE OF LAW

IMPLEMENTED A DIGITIZATION PROJECT TARGETING REVENUE STREAMS

such as property rent, water rates, advertisement fees, and parking fee collections. Developed a web-based application for managing advertisement and parking fees, incorporating features like geo-tagging and online payment integrations.

DEVELOPMENT OF A FINANCIAL RECORDS & INFORMATION MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (FRIMS):

- Operations Centre Setup: An operations centre for the Financial Records Information Management System (FRIMS) was constructed/established in LCB Building in Peshawar.
- System Deployment: FRIMS was implemented to automate and streamline the tax collection process in nineteen selected Tehsil Municipal Administrations (TMAs) of KPK. This initiative aims to digitize revenue data and improve tax management for local governments in KPK. This implementation has enhanced efficiency and reduced the likelihood of errors or fraud in the process.

DISTRIBUTED OVER 25,000 CORONA SAFETY KITS TO ENHANCE SAFETY MEASURES DURING THE PANDEMIC AMONG THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (KPK) STAFF AND SANITARY WORKERS.

A MOBILE APPLICATION WAS DEVELOPED FOR ONLINE PAYMENT OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT TAXES. THIS INITIATIVE WAS SIGNIFICANT AS IT REDUCED TRAVEL COSTS FOR TAXPAYERS, ENABLING THEM TO PAY TAXES ONLINE FROM HOME WITHOUT THE NEED TO VISIT BANKS OR LOCAL COUNCIL OFFICES.

CONDUCTED A COMPREHENSIVE STUDY AND HELD POLICY DIALOGUES ON POLICE REFORMS AND THE CREATION OF A PROVINCIAL POLICE SERVICE (PPS).
